#### Journal of Irish Studies: theme for the 2003 issue

The 2003 issue of the *Journal* will focus on the theme of contemporary Irish poetry, with an emphasis on younger poets - that is, the generation now in their 40s or younger. Over the summer, the Editor of the *Journal*, Peter McMillan, will be in Ireland talking to poets and collecting poetry for next year's issue. He will also be hoping for academic papers with a similar focus - either surveys of Irish poetry since the 1970s offering a broad view of the field and trying to define new directions, or papers on individual poets or on poets working out of similar backgrounds or locality, preoccupations or sets of difficulty. Needless to say, by Irish poetry, we mean poetry coming out of the islands of Ireland.

Peter McMillan and other members of the editorial committee of the *Journal of Irish Studies* will be at the October conference in Hiroshima and will welcome the opportunity there to look over early submissions of papers for the 2003 issue.

Important: if you are thinking of submitting an article, please note that the deadline for the 2003 Journal will be December 14th 2002. This deadline will be strictly observed.

----Obituary------

Professor Yasunari Takahashi, a long serving member of IASIL Japan, died aged seventy on June 24, 2002. He was a member of the executive committee of our society from 1984 to 1993. I personally recall the festive atmosphere of the inaugural conference of IASIL Japan held at Waseda University in 1984, when Professor Takahashi gave an impressive talk on Brian Friel's *Translations* in the symposium "On Irish Drama", chaired by Ann Saddlemeyer.

Since the publication of *Poetry of Ecstasy* (1966), Takahashi had engaged deeply with an astonishing range of literature, from Lewis Carol to Shakespeare, the Noh and kyogen, and especially Samuel Beckett. In his *Guardian* obituary (July 16) John Casey of Caius, Cambridge, vividly surveyed the more memorable aspects of this brilliant scholar's life.

Yasunari Takahashi was Professor of English at Tokyo University (1976-92), before joining Showa Women's University (1992-2002). He is survived by his wife, and their son and daughter.
