Guest speakers: We are honoured to have two guest speakers: Cathal Ó Searcaigh, an Irish Poet from Donegal, and Professor Frances Devlin-Glass from Australia, Visiting Megumikai Professor of English Literature, Kobe College. Mr. Ó Searcaigh will give a poetry reading and a a special lecture and Prof. Devlin-Glass will give a special lecture in which she will talk about the implication of the Irish Literary Revival for an endangered Aboriginal culture and language (Yanyuwa) in contemporary Australia.

Since this is the 20th Anniversary Year of IASIL JAPAN, our ex-President, Professor Tetsuro Sano, Professor Emeritus of Kyoto University, will give the keynote lecture, 'Twenty Years A-Growing: from IASAIL-Japan to IASIL Japan.'

During the Conference ten papers will be presented and two symposia will be organized. One of the symposia will be on Frank O'Connor's short stories to commemorate his Centennial. The other will be on the short poem in Ireland.

Here is a note from the Election Officer, Professor Jacqueline Hurtley:

I am writing to inform you that the AGM, held in Debrecen last Friday, 11th July, did not oppose the solution which, I understand, was agreed between Professors Murray and Toraiwa, i.e. that the nominations for Japan should be recognised as Japan's Vice-Chair and representatives for 2003-2006. They were, of course, voted for by members in other parts of the world. I deeply regret that Japanese members did not have the opportunity to vote on this occasion.

In another e-mail she has said, "Please apologise on my behalf to all members in Japan." The Office would like to apologize here too. We should have noticed and written to her earlier.
