We had remarkable two days with multinational guest speakers, Prof. Michael Cronin from Dublin City University, Mr. Theo Dorgan and Ms. Paula Meehan from Ireland and Michael Crummey from the "Rock" ie Newfoundland, Canada. 2. Journal of Irish Studies

The Board of *Journal of Irish Studies* announces two important decisions about editorial procedures:

1. Qualifications for submitting papers to JIS: JIS invites all members of IASIL JAPAN to submit essays on any aspect of Irish studies, And in addition, works of fiction, poetry, artworks as well as interviews, or other writings deemed of particular relevance to Irish studies in Japan by either the members or non-members of IASIL JAPAN, may also be

submitted for consideration.

2. The maximum length of papers: from next issue onwards the maximum length of papers or any other writings should be within 4,000 words, mainly because it will enable the journal to publish as many quality writings as possible by restricted expenditure.

The deadline for submissions to the Journal of Irish Studies Vol. XXII is 25 April 2007.

3. Irish University Review

The special issue on John Banville of *Irish University Review* (Spring/Summer 2006) was published, but its copies have not arrived at the office yet.
