#### 1. IASIL JAPAN 2012 Conference

As has been announced IASIL Japan 2012 Conference will meet on Oct. 6 (Sat.) & Oct 7(Sun) at Meiji University, Surugadai Campus. Please find the program and resumes in the envelope. One of the guest speakers has been changed from Dr. Irene de Angelis to Dr. Wolfgang Zach, whose background introduction is as follows:

Chair of English Language and Literature at the University of Innsbruck since 1994. Former Vice-President of the International Association for the Study of Anglo-Irish Literature and of the European Association for Commonwealth Literature and Language Studies. Dr. Zach's research interests comprise Shakespeare, 18th- and 20th-Century British Literature and Culture, Anglo-Irish Literature and Culture, New Literatures in English (esp. transcultural aspects), Literary Theory (esp. metacriticism, postcolonial criticism) and National Images and Stereotypes.

Dr. Zach has been invited as Visiting Professor/Research Fellow at the University of Münster, Mansfield College Oxford, University of Trieste, National University of Singapore, University of Nigeria, Doshisha University Kyoto, University of Halle-Wittenberg, Concordia University Montreal etc. Also, he hosted several international conferences and received various awards for his scholarly work. He is a coeditor of two journals and three series of monographs.

# IASIL Conference, Concordia University, Montreal

2012 IASIL Conference was held at Concordia University, Montreal, Canada from 30 July to 3 August. The conference theme is: Weighing Words: Interdisciplinary Engagements with and within Irish Literatures. Concordia University is situated in one of the most lively and bustling street blocks in Montreal. The delegates could enjoy cosmopolitan, modern-city atmosphere around the conference venue. The deliberate and heart-warm welcome of the organizers, Prof. Michael Kenneally, Dr. Rhona Richman Kenneally and Dr. Susan Cahill, and sincere efforts of the staff members boosted academic exchanges and solidified IASIL members' comradeliness.

In the final printed version of the programme, 142 papers can be found. Joep Leerssen, Gerardine Meaney and David Lloyd delivered keynote lectures. Jane Urquhart, Kevin Barry, Leontia Flynn, Anne Enright and Claire Kilroy did author readings. In a roundtable discussion, "The Future of Irish Literary Studies," the delegates from all over the world considered the contemporary situations of Irish "literary" studies and exchanged their views and opinions.

Thanks to the organizers' deep consideration and friendship for Japanese members, the period of this conference was set at the end of July and the beginning of August. The panel organized by three delegates from the University of Kitakyushu was very conspicuous in the programme. Nevertheless, it may have been desirable, if more papers or panels by the members of Japanese branch could have been found there.

At the IASIL Executive Meeting and the Annual General Meeting, Prof. Margaret Kelleher, the President of IASIL, and top executives presented how stably IASIL was being operated, although a modest proposal on membership fee may be done the next year. The plan for the next conference was shown as follows: it will be held at Queen's University, Belfast from 22 July to 26 July 2013. The conference theme will be: Urban Cultures.
