About the Guest Speakers

Patrick Lonergan is Professor of Drama and Theatre Studies at NUI Galway. His research is on such areas as contemporary Irish drama, Shakespeare and Ireland, theatre and social media, and globalization and performance. Publications include *Theatre and Globalization* (Winner of the 2008 Theatre Book Prize) and *The Theatre and Films of Martin McDonagh* (2012). He is director of the Irish Theatrical Diaspora Project, an Executive member of the International Association for the Study of Irish Literatures, and a Board Member of Baboro International Arts Festival for Children. He is also the academic editor of Abbey Theatre Archive Digitization Project.

Alan Gilsenan is an award-winning Irish filmmaker, writer and theatre director. His many films include *The Road To God Knows Where, All Souls' Day, The Green Fields of France, Zulu 9, The Ghost of Roger Casement, Timbuktu,* as well as the acclaimed documentary series *The Asylum, The Hospice* and *I See A Darkness*. For the theatre, he has directed his own adaptation of John Banville's *The Book of Evidence,* Tom Murphy's *The Patriot Game and On The Inside/On the Outside,* amongst others. Most recently, he directed the drama-documentary *Eliza Lynch, Queen of Paraguay,* the experimental film *A Vision: A Life of WB Yeats,* and has just completed writing and directing the feature film *Unless.* He is a former Chairman of the Irish Film Institute and a board member of both the Irish Film Board and RTÉ, Ireland's public service broadcaster.

4. Report of IASIL 2016, University College of Cork, Ireland

On July 25-29, 2016, the annual conference of the IASIL was hosted by University College Cork (Coláiste na hOllscoile Corcaigh). The theme of the conference was 'Change'.

The number of delegates was said to be almost 300, nearly three times that of last year. Normally there were eight panels taking place at the same time, so I was always torn between several panels. The programme leaflet offered not only the information about paper readings and lectures but also about current events and things to see in Cork and even about a conference pub that had a special offer for conference participants.

Delegates from Japan who read papers were Kaori Hirashige, Hiroko Ikeda, Ryuji Ishikawa, Masaya Shimokusu, Toshiki Tatara, Naoko Toraiwa, Shotaro Yamauchi and Akemi Yoshida; Haruko Takakuwa chaired a panel. On the third afternoon, we had some free time and could choose among a trip of Cobh (the last port of call for the *Titanic*), a Cork walking tour, or a Crawford Art Gallery tour. There were not only plenary talks from Prof Jahan Ramazani (U of Virginia), Dr Anne Mulhall (UCD) and Dr Heather Laird (UCC), but also a variety of sessions and events such as 'Frank O'Connor Reading and Roundtable' with contemporary Irish novelists; 'Prose Reading by Louise O'Neill, Rob Doyle and Lisa McInerney'; a book launch for *Irish Women's Writings*, 1878-1922: Advancing the Cause of Liberty; a project launch for 'Nation, Genre and Gender'; a seminar on 'Ecocriticism, and Ecofeminism in Irish Studies' and a 'Roundtable on Irish Film'; and other smaller forums. One of the highlights was the poetry reading on the fourth evening, with poets from UCC: Nuala Ní Dhomhnaill, Theo Dorgan, Louis De Paor, and Leanne O'Sullivan. Theo Dorgan read his latest poem, which he had contributed to the event 'A Poet's Rising' organized as part of the 1916 centenary celebrations (http://irishwriterscentre.ie/pages/a-poets-rising).
