1) "Japan Corner" at Dublin City Library

Thanks to the members of IASIL Japan and other Irish Related Societies, 106 Japanese translations of Irish Literatures were donated to Dublin City Library. I would like to express special gratitude to Prof. Seishi Matsuda and Prof. Yasuhito Sato for their special support.

On 18 February, as a 60th anniversary of Japan-Ireland Diplomatic Relations commemorative event, 106 Japanese translations of Irish literary works were presented by Ambassador Mari Miyoshi on behalf of 6 organisations in Japan to Mr. Brendan Teeling, Deputy City Librarian, Dublin City Public Libraries.

This project was coordinated by Prof. Akiko Manabe, Shiga Univ. Japan, and the books were donated by The Japan Ireland Society, IASIL Japan (International Association for the Study of Irish Literatures), The Yeats Society of Japan, The James Joyce Society of Japan, The Oscar Wilde Society of Japan, and The Lafcadio Hearn Memorial Museum.

The Embassy also staffed an information stand on the day providing visitors with information on Japan and Japanese culture.

2) Shigeyama Sengoro Kyogen in Ireland: The Cat and the Moon and Chin Chin Kobakama

Between 24 July-1 August 2017, the Shigeyama Sengoro Family will give the first performance of W.B. Yeats' *The Cat and the Moon* in the Japanese *kyogen* style in Ireland and the world premiere of Lafcadio Hearn's *Chin Chin Kobakama* in Japanese *kyogen* style. The venues will be Smock Alley Theatre in Dublin, Factory Performance Space in Sligo (with the Blue Raincoat Theatre Company) and Garter Lane Arts Centre in Waterford.
