






Location

Kyoto

Kyoto Notre Dame University is located in Japan's world famous ancient capital city of Kyoto, 45km (27 miles) from Osaka, 514km (320 miles) west of Tokyo. The City of Kyoto is rich in cultural heritage where tradition and new contemporary culture co-exist in harmony. Since its foundation in 794, Kyoto flourished as the cultural and political capital of Japan for over a thousand years until 1868, when the capital was moved to Tokyo. Surrounded by the natural beauty of the Kyoto basin, the Kitayama and Higashiyama forests rim the city, and the picturesque Kamo River runs the length of the city from north to south. Thousands of temples, shrines, and gardens built in the long history of Kyoto since the 8th century have been well preserved, and seventeen of them were recognized as the UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Sites in 1994.

 Kokusaikaikan, get off at K03 Kitayama Station,
 7min. walk from Exit 1.
- From Hankyu-Line Karasuma Station
